INTRODUCTION

The initial accession of records took place in 1969 when the Minute Books, Journals of the Proceedings and the Treasurer's Accounts were deposited in the Maritime College Archives. In 1975 a second group was accessioned. These records consisted of Allotment and Cash Books, Membership Dues Books and Minutes, from May 10, 1948 to December 13, 1954. There were also accounts of Marine Society members compiled by Nelson Proctor, several Society Certificates and an old copy of the By-laws (1811). Also included were Records of the Retreat Property, receipts from chartered cruises taken from 1909-1913 and photographs of members (c.1950's) as well as copies of the Marine Society Charter. Audits by the Horace S. Ely and Company were a part of the financial records.

In November 1769, thirty-two people met in the Exchange Building to discuss the formation of a society to provide relief for distressed ship masters, or their widows and children, and to promote maritime knowledge. A committee was appointed to draw up articles. These were adopted and served as the basis of the charter granted by King George III for “The Marine Society of the City of New York in the Province of New York in America”, incorporated in April 1770. Membership quickly grew.

During the Revolutionary War, members sided with both camps; loyalist groups aided English troops in the defense of New York City and the Sons of Liberty counted many Marine Society members in its ranks. In 1786, by Act of Legislature, the Society became “The Marine Society of the City of New York, in the State of New York”. Membership was not limited to masters of vessels, but included merchants, attorneys and many other prominent individuals with an interest in maritime affairs. Such members included Alexander Hamilton, John Marshall and Leonard Lispenard, first Presidents of the Society. In 1783, George Washington and De Witt Clinton became Honorary Members.

While the Society diligently carried out its charitable obligations, it also fulfilled its other purpose, that of furthering maritime knowledge. There were petitions for lighthouses along the coast and the placement of buoys in the channels, tests on the durability of various woods used in ship building, and the examination of new charts to determine their accuracy. In 1873, the Marine Society petitioned the New York State Legislature for a school to train officers in the Merchant Marine and helped to bring about the establishment of the New York Nautical School aboard the ST. MARY’S. Today that school is the Maritime College, whose archives serve as repository for Marine Society records. During both world conflicts, Society members served as masters of troop and cargo vessels and in the War Shipping Administration which controlled all merchant shipping.

Members also serve actively in other charitable Marine Societies. In 1801, Capt. Robert Richard Randall established the Sailors’ Snug Harbor in his will. This institution provides free care for old or disabled seamen. The President and Vice-President of the Marine Society serve, by office, as members of its Board of Trustees. In 1854 the Marine Society founded the Mariner’s Family Home on Staten Island, which provides for the wives or relatives of seamen.

“Retreat Property”, mentioned often in Society records, has a long history. Briefly, in 1784, the State of New York passed an Act to establish a quarantine hospital for the Port of New York. Funds accumulated from a tax paid by every passenger and seaman entering the Port. Thirty acres of land were bought on Staten Island and a small hospital was built. Open from June to October, it was used only for persons entering the United States who were suffering from infectious diseases. The cost of maintaining the hospital was small, but the receipts from the tax were so large, that by 1831, there was a credit balance of \$341,000. Since a large part of this tax was paid by seamen who received little or no benefit from the hospital, another Act was passed, allowing the tax collected from the seamen to be paid into a special account called “The Seamen’s Fund and Retreat”. This fund was administered by a Board of Trustees, including the President of the Marine Society. Thirty-five acres was purchased on Staten Island and in 1853 a hospital was built. Known as the Seaman’s Retreat”, it cared for sick and disabled seamen and was the first of its kind in this port.

In 1851, the State Legislature directed that the Trustees of the Seaman’s Fund give six acres of Retreat Property and \$10,000 to establish the Mariner’s Family Asylum, and in addition, to allot annual sums for its upkeep. Other monies from the Fund were allocated to support charities not connected with seamen. When the Fund eventually ran out, the Marine Society sought the help of the Federal Government to provide facilities for the care of sick and disabled seamen. It recommended that while the title of the Retreat property remain in the Marine Society, the property should be sold, proceeds of this sale to be divided between the Mariner’s Family Asylum, the Society for the Relief of Destitute Children of Seamen and the Marine Society.

In 1882, the State Legislature passed a law which vested title to the Retreat Property in the Marine Society. The following year, the Society leased the property to the Marine Hospital Service. Although United States officials were willing to establish a Federal Marine Hospital on the property, efforts were blocked by local residents and twenty years passed before favorable legislation was enacted in 1903. Then, the Federal Government bought all but five acres for \$300,000 and established a fine Marine Hospital. The money was shared by the groups mentioned above. In 1931 the remaining five acres was sold to the government and the proceeds shared once more.

Today, the Marine Society continues to be a thriving Society, dedicated to the founding principles set forth in its charter over two hundred years ago.
