Mission, History and Opportunities

- **Mission Statement:** To foster future maritime professionals by promoting and supporting maritime related education through financial assistance, events and initiatives.
- **History:** The CMA Education Foundation ("CMA EF") continues the support of future leaders of the maritime industry that was initiated by the Connecticut Maritime Association ("CMA") in 1984. Since 2011, the CM AEF, a 501c(3) tax-exempt nonprofit organization, has awarded scholarships, hosted industry research paper competitions and subsidized internships at maritime companies.
- Support and Engagement Opportunities: The CMA EF appreciates all donations to fulfill our mission and increase the level of financial assistance provided to the maritime students. By working with the CMA, the CMA EF provides opportunities for maritime professionals to get involved through the internship and scholarship programs. Maritime professionals are also invited to join the Board or become a mentor to a scholar.

Programs

- Intern Program: The CMA EF supports the hands-on learning that occurs outside of the classroom at maritime companies and encourages the development of future maritime professionals. The Program allows CMA members to connect with those embarking on maritime studies and careers. Internship stipends are provided to students working as interns at CMA member, domestic, maritime companies that are interested in pursuing a career in the maritime industry. Applications accepted on a rolling basis.
- Scholarship Program: The CMA EF Scholarship Program provides financial support to students who are excelling in maritime studies in college or graduate school and to high school seniors who are interested in pursuing maritime studies in college or a maritime career after high school. Each year. top awards of \$10,000 are paid directly to schools as tuition reimbursement Scholarships. Multiple one-time Scholarship Awards ranging from \$500 \$5,000 are awarded and made payable directly to the student. Applications are reviewed by the CMA EF Board of Directors. Winners are based on academic achievement, quality of essay, letters of recommendation and those who best demonstrate their interest in a career in the maritime industry.
- Business of Shipping Competition: In partnership with the CMA, students attending U.S. colleges and universities with programs and/or courses on the shipping industry, international trade, marine transportation, marine science, and marine engineering submit papers on industry topics. Winning students present their papers at the CMA's annual Shipping Trade Show and Conference. To qualify a student must be an individual working towards a bachelor's or master's degree at a US university or college. All papers must be original manuscripts and the topics should have practical application to industry problems, issues, or policies. All topics related to the Business of Shipping are acceptable. Individuals from academia and industry review the papers, and three papers are selected and awarded certificates, with a first place award of \$2,500, second place award of \$1,500, and third place award of \$1,000. The awards are courtesy of d'Amico International Shipping.

Preparing the boats required chipping paint, priming, painting the bilges, cleaning the engine rooms and wheelhouses, and preparing the paperwork that is required to be onboard. This gave me a unique view into the corporate and legal side of the company. In addition, I observed and participated in the inspection by serving as a deckhand for man overboard drills and testing the fire pump. I gained valuable hands-on experience, invaluable references, and a job offer when I graduate from Massachusetts Maritime Academy. I am extremely grateful for the experience and opportunity Captain Pyle and Wilmington Tug have given me."


