Maritime Adventure Camp is for *everyone!* The *Dr. DeAngelis Financial Assistance and Scholarship Program* helps families access all the fun our program has to offer. This opportunity is meant for young people interested in getting out on the water this summer who may not otherwise have the resources to participate. Awards are granted based on application and range from 10-80% of the registration fee.

To apply for Financial Assistance, please carefully read the following information.

To Apply

- 1. Please read the Frequently Asked Questions (below) thoroughly before applying
- 2. The parent(s)/legal guardian(s) who is financially responsible for the camper must complete the Application
- 3. Completed Applications received by the Waterfront by April 1, 2022, will receive priority consideration. Applications will be accepted after this date, on a rolling basis, space permitting.

- 5. If you are unable to complete the application online, please contact the Waterfront for a paper application.
- 6. The maximum award is 80% of the registration fee.
- 7. For applications received by April 1 you will be notified of your award status by April 9. You must accept or decline your award by April 15 and pay a deposit for 50% of your remaining registration fee. The balance of the registration fee is due one month before the program begins.

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Frequently Asked Questions

Am I eligible to apply?

Campers applying for financial assistance must be:

- Entering 5th 9th grades for Boat Camp; 3rd & 4th grades for Splash Camp
- Able to attend camp for an entire session. Campers are not permitted to arrive late or leave early during the camp day.
- Physically, mentally, emotionally, willing and capable of participating fully in the program.
- Able to demonstrate financial need based on the application

Awards will be granted without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, nationality, ancestry, sex, sexual orientation, or gender identity.

If my child qualifies, will they definitely receive an Award?

No, not all eligible applicants will receive financial assistance.

How are applicants chosen for Awards?

Awards are based on: 1) demonstrated financial need, 2) potential for growth and development, 3) background and experience which will broaden the diversity of the program, 4) interest and involvement in the program, 5) space availability. Priority is given to applicants who are new to the program or are returning for their second summer.

Who decides if my child is chosen for an Award?

Recommendations for Awards are made by the Scholarship Committee.

When will I find out if my child is chosen for an Award?

Applications received by April 1 will be notified by e-mail by April 9 of the status of their Award. If you do not have access to email, please contact the Waterfront to make other arrangements.

I'm not sure I will receive an Award. Should I go ahead and register my child to reserve a space and still apply?

We do reserve space in camp for scholarship applicants. If you are awarded assistance, you will be given a code to register online with a discount. However, if you prefer a specific session and you do not want to wait to see if you've received an Award, you may register online before you've been notified. Based on your award status, you may be eligible for a refund, but an Award is not guaranteed.

If chosen for an Award, will I have to pay any money?

Yes. Awards range from 10% to 80% of the total cost of registration. If chosen for any type of Award, we will ask you to pay a deposit of the *discounted* tuition to secure your child's space and commit to the program by April 15. The remaining balance of the tuition is due one month before the program begins.

Is transportation provided to and from camp?

No. The MTA does operate the BX40 bus directly to campus.
