If you have not done so yet, sign up for **RaveAlert**, in your desktop or laptop computer, tablet, or cell phone device. Texts and voicemails are sent to those who sign up for the free service. **UPD** provides SUNY Maritime College with professional safety and law enforcement services that include incident response, investigation, and follow up of all safety, security, and law enforcement related matters that come to our attention. We strive to engage our community via education, information sharing and training programs, as our strongest ally in deterrence and prevention. maintenance of a campus environment that supports academic excellence, independent thought, and cultural collaboration.
